

COMMON LAND Tir Comin Plwyf Penmachno (C.L.25)
Parish of Penmachno
County of Conwy

Notice is hereby given that Roger Moss has applied to the Welsh Ministers for consent under section 23(2) of the National Trust Act 1971 to carry out restricted works on Tir Comin Plwyf Penmachno.

The proposed works (on land to the west of Hafod y Rhedrwydd) are:

- (i) water extraction screens and weir to aid fish passage in Afon y Foel at SH76174568
- (ii) weather station sensors and a small settling tank connected to (i) via 40 m of pipe, beside the stream at SH76204571
- (iii) 220 m of buried pipe and conduit running in a north-easterly direction between (ii) and the common land boundary at SH76384577.
- (iv) A temporary access point through the fence at SH76414571. (This will be kept sheep-proof at all times and reinstated after use).

All works will be subject to approval by Natural Resources Wales. The pipe burial will be backfilled to restore the original turf and minimise any visual impact.

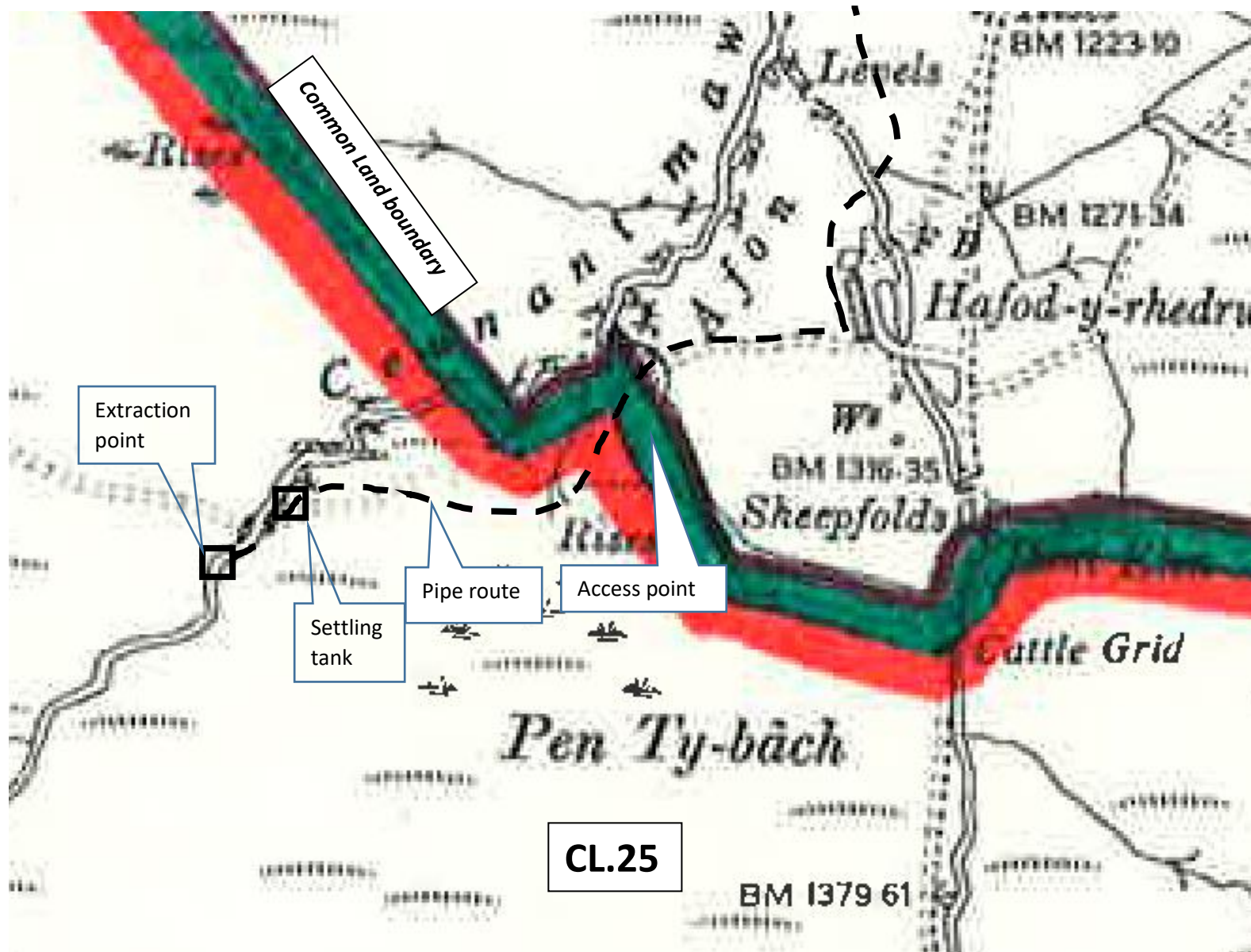
